

LIVE IT

At the end of the day, the Jewish religious leaders were guilty of blaspheming the Holy Spirit because they didn't believe that Jesus came from God. To deny Jesus is to deny the Holy Spirit and the very mission of God. If we've already put our faith in Jesus, I don't think we're likely to do that. However, I do think this teaches us that we must be careful whenever we evaluate another church, ministry, pastor, or theological perspective. We can't cast blame or call evil something that we don't know enough about, or just because it's different from what we know. Jesus tells us in Matthew 12:33-37 to judge a tree by the fruit it bears. Jesus was obviously bearing good fruit by casting out demons.

May we never call the work of God the work of the devil!
